Honorable Members of the Dundee City Council and Chief Stock,

I am writing to make a formal offer on the 1990 E-One Protector Fire Engine you have listed for sale. Upon discovering the truck, my department has worked diligently over the past few days raising \$8200 for its purchase through community donations and that is what we currently have available to offer for the purchase of the truck.

Monument is a small remote town of 127 residents, no full-time city employees and an all-volunteer fire department of 8 operating on \$2000 annual budget. That is not a typo and I did not forget a zero - that is two thousand dollars to run fire protection for the city and surrounding area. There is no rural department in the area and the city provides protection for the hundreds of residents within about a 15-mile radius. With only one truck, this poses a specific problem. When we respond to a call outside the city, we are leaving the city unprotected. Although we have trained firefighters still available for a second call, we have no equipment to operate.

Monument Fire Department has focused what little resources we have toward training of our crew with all members now at least basic. Nonetheless, most of our budget is spent on fuel and repairs each year as we depend upon hand-me-downs for such items as PPE and even our SCBAs. It has been especially challenging trying to procure a second truck over the past few years. While it is not difficult to get a stripped down or broken down truck donated or for a couple thousand dollars, we do not have the resources to outfit it or local expertise to repair in order to get one into service when it is more than 3 hours to the nearest pump or diesel repair shop.

It will only be through a combination of the support of our local community and the sharing of resources and assistance from a better-off community that we are able to equip our fire department. I sincerely appreciate your consideration for our small town as you decide the disposition of your excess engine and the city is hopeful that you accept our offer of \$8200 for its purchase.
