1	Hwy 99 street lights/sidewalk work/road construction is way behind schedule and frankly embarrassing. Need better river access and trails. Mountain biking trail system would be great. Need to market more businesses to take advantage of the wine crowd, but make services available to residents, not just tourists. City should solicit markets, affordable restaurants, shops, etc to support residents. Tired of driving to Newberg for everything.
2	I feel that well over 2/3s of the streets in Dundee do not allow for safe pedestrian traffic with no sidewalks.
3	Supporting livability does not necessarily mean bringing more businesses and people to Dundee. Many of us are here because it had the "small town" style of living, this is what made Dundee attractive to many of its long time residents. Progress does not have to mean more people, traffic, etc.
4	I believe that our opportunity to improve this is to add additional Carter paid firefighters to our local fire department to ensure the city maintains its commitment to its residents.
5	I disagree that Dundee public services Improves safety. The police department and fire departments need more support from city council and the mayor. It's time to step up and ensure these life saving departments have the equipment and staffing they need.
6	The city has no identity. A great logo. No business center or civic center. Just a row of undeveloped establishments needing beautification
7	I agree that the City government is carrying out its mission to provide public services but want to make sure that Dundee stays they small town that it is and doesn't start trying to become a Oregon version of a Napa Valley tourist city.

8	My family just moved to Dundee in April, we have not really been here long enough to get a feel for the direction Dundee is heading.
9	When is the last time you did an audit the the amount of time the police spend in town ? What a waste of tax dollars!
10	I feel that the City Government does not take its public services seriously. The police response times are horrible from Newberg when there is no officer in Dundee. The fire department is behind times. We have a new fire hall and still rely on volunteers from home. Dundee Public Works is a waste of space. This city looks horrible as vegetation is out of control, weeds are everywhere and pot holes are crumbling on city streets (Not just the Hwy).
11	Communication and interaction between my self and any city employees/elected officials have always been cordial, informative and of a timely manner. Nice to live in a small town.
12	I have no idea which public services Dundee provides, but just look forward to all the construction being completed so that we can drive in and out of town without issue and massive congestion.
13	It seems to me that the Mission Statement for the City should make mention of the citizenry as well as its leadership. As it currently reads, it is top-down. It could be added at the end something similar to this: "for the happiness, contentment and thorough enjoyment of the Residents of Dundee, including the young and old, small and large businesses, local and federal offices, so that all may feel welcomed, included and accepted, without reservation."
14	Road conditions within the Dundee City limits are not safe, do not improve the livability or economic vitality of the community. This includes lack of commitment to sidewalks and bike lanes which force increases of vehicular traffic, leading to intolerable congestion and environmental degradation. The decision of the Council to recommend approval of an unsightly and unsafe Verizon phone tower within the context of an established Main Street improvement plan is in total contradiction to city government's stated mission. Fortunately the people of Dundee had the foresight to engage and mount a protest that lead to the planning commission's wise decision to support the residents of Dundee to prohibit construction of power. I am appalled and embarrassed that the citizens of Dundee and the municipal government do not support the Newberg public library through property tax assessment. Much to the libraries credit children of Dundee are allowed to access library services at no charge despite the blatant lack of support for library services. In no way does an uneducated populace contribute to the cities mission. The city of Dundee and its residents should make the support of the library system an investment priority now and in the future.
15	I own a business in town and feel there were way to many hurdles getting it going. To encourage economic vitality the city should encourage new business and be helpful through the permit process.

	The Newberg/Dundee police department does not cover the city as well as the Dundee police did. I rarely see the Newberg police drive through my neighborhood and patrol. For example, I called to report what looked like a drug deal going on next to my house and 40 minutes later they called and asked if it was the migrant workers working in the field. Then

26	Projects along Highway 99 including the new sidewalks and new businesses should improve the livability, safety and economic vitality of the community.
27	Needs better streets with walkable sidewalks, areas to ride bikes

29	Waiting to see how there might be improvements to the downtown area once the bypass and street improvements are completed. I hope that there will be an effort to improve the appearance and interest for both tourists and residents
30	I suspect there's a ton our city government is doing for us that we citizens take for granted and don't even realize they are doing. All I know is that I don't really have any complaints--except for the terrible traffic problem . . . And I'm truly hoping that will clear up once the by-pass is complete. For the most part, I feel safe and thoroughly and enjoy a highly livable neighborhood. It would be nice, however, to see downtown Dundee more attractive and prosperous--with better traffic management.

34	The City government does not do a good job with zoning issues. Businesses continue in residential areas, motor homes are parked for months in residential areas and short term rentals appear to be allowed in residential areas. Makes the City a hodge podge mess.
35	Have not heard of any programs for any of this.
36	I'm sure that more could be done, but it would be necessary to pay for more through more taxes! A balance must be struck - Dundee is doing OK as far as that goes.
37	Developments have become increasingly small lot sizes increasing profits for developers and revenue for the city short-term...long-term problems of people living so close together, high water and sewer rates that benefit future development and hurt older towns people seems like you are missing livability big time.
38	I'm surprised the "shortcuts" were allowed to build those houses across from Fortune park without improving the road, or putting in sidewalks. It is more dangerous now, maybe they will finish the job in the spring?

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- The city's economic vitality is substantially linked to support for current and future businesses along 99W. A holistic approach is critical to that business development. Businesses along 99W will undoubtedly be predominately be in the retail and service sectors, including expansion of the existing tasting rooms and restaurants. As a former restaurant owner, I know the importance of maintaining a stable, high quality work force. These workers make a very modest income. A major problem for new employers in Dundee will be finding and keeping the employees they need. Perhaps the biggest constraining factor is the almost complete absence of affordable housing in this area. Newberg, Dundee and McMinnville have few to no affordable rental units. If workers cannot find housing within a reasonable distance from their workplace, they will look elsewhere. Affordable housing will not appear in this part of Yamhill County because there is a demand for it. There is too much money to made building single family homes. To create housing necessary for a stable service sector workforce, the city will have to get involved. I have not heard much from the city regarding this issue. City government should develop a plan for encouraging construction of affordable housing. Included could be mixed use buildings along 99W, streamlining permitting and development regulations, flexible land use decisions for the types of housing that can be constructed. The city has sufficient undeveloped land away from existing neighborhoods that could be used to developed affordable housing. The existing character of those neighborhood need not be affected. The city's business development goals will not be realized unless this need is addressed.
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- Roads are in bad shape, no dog parks. Only a few Resturants, most are over priced.

1	Possibly, but movement has been very slow. It's hard to tell. There is certainly a lot of potential.
2	Recent improvements (IE sidewalk project) are needed and the cleaning up of some of the older/vacant places on hwy 99 have made a nice improvement (not sure why we needed painted tiles in the sidewalk though as almost immediately the color is scraping away and I don't know that those really bring any value to the community.
3	Very very slow. Dundee isn't a small town anymore. We have become a well know city that many people visit. Our city needs to speed up its growth to meet the needs.
4	Solid property values are good, but there needs to be a place for the middle class to live as well. We need affordable housing.
5	City planning is and has been 'top secret' since we moved here almost 20 years ago. The bypass details were never posted, or made known to residents on city website. I did attend one neighborhood meeting the city made on the corner of 8th and Boysen years ago; City could have conducted similar info meetings at the affected sites; it was effective.
6	I believe in the making improvements to keep Dundee from becoming run down, but get concerned at times that there is a push toward building this city up for tourism. I want to retain the small town that I moved to.
7	Creating more of a destination as well as providing basic services to residents is important.
8	From what we've seen, mainly the improvements being made on 99 through town, the city of Dundee seems to have a plan.
9	Too many houses being built. However, I like the progress of the businesses opening on 99. I just wish there was more variety other than wineries. We need more restaurants. Maybe a donut shop.
10	It seems to me that our City is the heart of wine-country. That is quite a feat accomplished.
11	I believe Dundee's stated priorities lean more toward economic development and growth then safety and livability, the later two if elevated to the highest priority to acquire and secure public access to expanded green space and the Willamette riverfront with sidewalks and bikeways to encourage reduction in vehicular traffic and environmental degradation.
12	I fully support the vision David has set out in the newsletter. Let's develop Dundee in to a premium wine country destination and watch all of our property values increase.
13	Please continue to work on building a community of Dundee to encourage and benefit more local residents: senior exercise class, interest groups, local connection groups.
14	The sidewalks and city lights coming into town are a huge improvement. With all the tourists that come to our area each year, we need to create an environment that will encourage new business and residential development.
15	I'm not totally in the know but assume the city is to grow in a way that advantages all. New houses on the hill blocking the view of those that have been here for years is not exactly a pleasant experience.
16	Main street renovations are a fantastic step in the right direction. (Tourism) Business growth needs to be actively encouraged along main street and 1 block behind on either side.
17	I appreciate the infrastructure upgrades. Looking forward to seeing how it plays out once the bypass is open.

18	As long as we keep the small town atmosphere which is why we moved here in the first place decades ago.
19	Town is losing its unique character, is developing too fast.
20	The area is the consistency of building permits that change platted roads and other community requirements. An example is the subdivision on Brier Place - the platted road issue was ignored, as was a desire of residents to keep the homes built there in line with those in the neighborhood. The result was that the platted road (1st street extended through the development to connect with the existing 1st street) was ignored, as was the request from the neighborhood residence for keeping the homes to be built in line with those that existed which were one story homes. In the case of the home design, it appears that money overrode the concerns and requests of citizens.

Our neighborhood was pleased that the city took seriously our complaints about speeding motorists on our pedestrian-filled street; they came out and installed a speed-check, etc. (However, I know this only tangentially, since I wasn't personally involved; I just saw the neighbors' "slowdown; we have children and pets!" signs and then noticed that someone--I'm assuming our city--came out and put up a speed check. Afterwards, the neighbors' signs got to stay up, so I'm guessing we were given permission to do so? Again, I don't know the details . . . However, it IS a problem on our road (Hidden Springs): there is an inordinate amount of traffic--much of it speeding. I'm hoping that some of this is simply due to people trying to find ways to "get around" the huge traffic snarl that has become Dundee . . . One other problem we have, though, that doesn't seem to get much attention, is wandering dogs. There doesn't seem to be anybody who wants to deal with this persistent nuisance, and I've been given the runaround more times than I care to recall. But again, I don't know if this is under the jurisdiction of the city or the county . . .
