New Benches for Harvey Creek Trail

In March, Phillip Staats addressed the Dundee City Council to ask about a possible Eagle Scout project helping with one of the Dundee city parks. After meeting with the Dundee Parks Advisory Committee, the decision was made to build and install two benches on the Harvey Creek Trail, a trail that Phillip had first hiked while a Cub Scout in Dundee. With help from his mom, he contacted Sheridan High School regarding a couple of trees that needed to be cut down and could be used as bench tops.

Thomas Lux, a former student of his mom's, assisted Phillip and another scout, Collin Howland, by cutting down the tree; then they contacted another family friend, Ryan Rowley, who provided a portable saw mill and helped cut the planks. Steel was then purchased from Newberg Steel and with help provided by Ryan Hawley of Metal Tech 4x4 the pipe supports for the bench were welded into form. Phillip then contacted Valmont Pacific in Tualatin, who graciously offered to galvanize the bench supports for free, and Murphy's Furniture in Cornelius who donated outdoor oil to finish the bench tops. Finally, Matt Ross helped by drilling the holes in the bench so that everything could be put together.





Thanks to this large community effort, in September, Phillip and his fellow scouts of Troop #520 installed the two new benches and were able to complete his Eagle Scout Project. One bench is near the footbridge crossing Harvey Creek and the second bench is placed near the beginning of the trail at the Dundee Pioneer Cemetery entrance. The Harvey Creek Trail is approximately 1.2 miles in length out and back, and has an elevation change of 300 feet from the Dundee Pioneer Cemetery to Harvey Creek.

These well-built benches offer an opportunity to persons enjoying the trail to rest and enjoy the sounds of Harvey Creek and the distant hillside views. The City wishes to extend our thanks to Phillip and the scouts of Troup #520.

Leash Law

We get it. Your dog is amazing and well-trained. You’ve been through extensive training and your dog knows a bunch of verbal commands. Your dog is the best-behaved dog you’ve ever had. We understand. However, while your dog may be pleasant and trained, what about the dog that’s on-leash that your dog approaches for a friendly hello? Are you sure that this dog will not react adversely? What about the elderly couple going for a stroll in the park? Are they able to handle 100-lbs. of happy, friendly doggy love without losing their balance? Effective September 20, 2019, the Dundee Municipal Code was amended to require dogs within public spaces, such as parks and sidewalks in Dundee, to be kept on a leash or other physical restraint by the owner or person responsible for the dog. A person found to be in violation of this provision is subject to a fine not to



exceed \$500.

If you would like your dog to be able to run off-leash, Chehalem Park and Recreation has a dog park available for your dog’s use at Ewing Young Historical Park, 1201 S. Blaine Street, Newberg, OR 97132. For rules of the dog park visit

Volunteer for Planning Commission

The City of Dundee is now accepting applications from persons interested in serving on the Planning Commission. Appointments will be made by the City Council at their meeting on Tuesday, January 7, 2020. Applications can be downloaded and printed from the City's website (www.dundee.org) or picked up at Dundee City Hall located at 620 SW 5th Street, and need to be delivered to City Hall by 12:00pm on December 31, 2019.

Street Sweeping

Street sweeping is provided by a sub-contractor who is scheduled to sweep the 3rd week of the month after trash day. We have also budgeted extra cleanings in November and December to clean the streets twice in those months. Their primary objective is reducing the amount of trash and pollution particulates that enter our storm drainage system and waterways. The City is required by permit to routinely sweep all curbed streets 12 times per year.

The following tips will assist our crew in providing optimal sweeping service on your street:

- Remove garbage cans, yard debris receptacles, and recycling carts, from the street as soon as possible once trash has been collected.
- Do not place basketball hoops in the street.
- Whenever possible, park vehicles in the driveway or garage.
- Refrain from blowing leaves or sweeping debris into the street.
- Trim or remove any vegetation - including trees - within or extending over the street, interfering with the use of the sidewalk or roadway, or obstructing a driver's view.
- Trim trees so that the minimum clearance of an overhanging portion is eight feet above the sidewalk and 15 feet above the roadway, bushes, shrubbery and other vegetation may not overhand the sidewalk or roadway.

Community Survey

As part of the biennial goal setting process in 2018, the City Council reviewed the results of a community survey conducted online. The responses from citizens and business owners was greatly appreciated and provided valuable insight for the decision makers. A copy of the 2018 survey results may be viewed via a link on the City of Dundee website: www.DundeeCity.org under the City Council tab.

The online community survey will start up again on November 18 and will stay open until December 13. A link will be provided on the front page of the City's website, but if you do not have access to the internet, a paper survey form may be picked up at Dundee City Hall. Your responses will be confidential and we encourage you to be frank and honest. The more surveys returned, the better informed the City Council will be on issues of concern that may be addressed by the city government.

2020 Census

The U.S. Census Bureau will be conducting the federal census in the spring of 2020, including a new online option. Households may also receive a mail-in form or may be contacted by an enumerator if a response is not received. The federal census is a requirement of the U.S. Constitution and is used to determine representation of states in congress based on population and guides the distribution of tax dollars back to communities to support vital services. Responses are confidential.

Temporary positions will be hired to assist with the census and range from \$17.50 to \$19.50 per hour, including training time. Persons interested in applying may do so online at www.2020census.gov/jobs.

New Extrication Equipment Needed

When we arrive upon motor vehicle accidents- or any type of emergency requiring rescue- Dundee Fire & Rescue relies heavily on extrication equipment. In order to get to, and treat, a patient rapidly in these situations extrication tools and techniques are essential. Unfortunately, the technology of our equipment is outdated and we are not able to keep up with modern vehicle technology.

Today, the force required to cut a typical car is 260,000 lbs of pressure. The cutters Dundee currently has cut at 160,000 lbs of pressure—well below the minimum cutting force required. Our goal is replace two sets of extrication equipment we keep in two of our engines. The department is confident that through some help from the city and using some extra funds set aside for the volunteers, enough can be raised in order to meet our goal of getting new equipment. Dundee Fire Department works closely with other Fire Departments, local schools, F.I.S.H. & LOVE INC. on this project. They will provide us with your Toy & Joy application if you have already completed one. **Applications are due no later than Dec. 17.**
